The story of the coming of Christ, as we know well, is more than angels and shepherds, and a baby in a stable. As we wind up the year, let us have this same attitude that Jesus did – the mind and heart of a servant. Let us think like Jesus, being kingdom minded, living a radically different way of life, expressing God's love and light to a dark world.

Cakes and other baked goods are available for a gold coin donation after the service. All proceeds go to missions work.

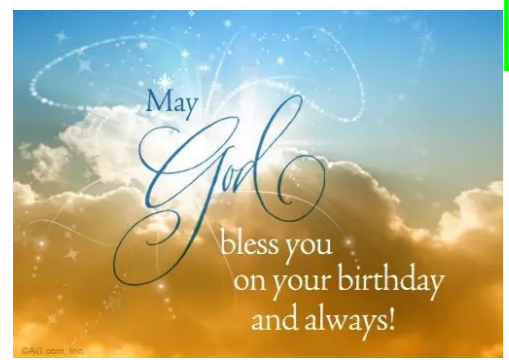

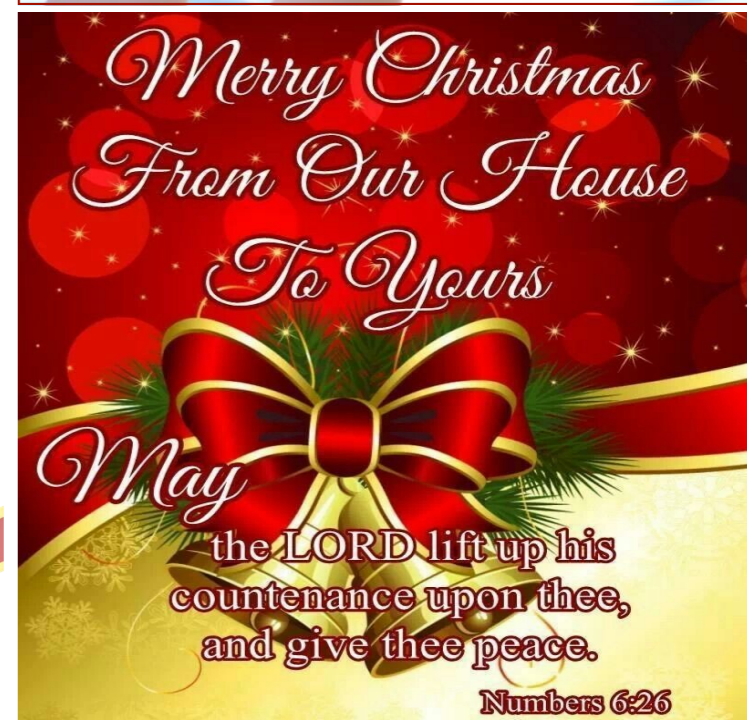

Book Review

A GATHERING MOMENTUM - Roger Sutton (Ed)

This book is a compilation of reports about the city-wide expressions of unity between Christian churches that have been springing up in the United Kingdom in recent years. Of course, talk about churches working together to impact their cities and towns for Christ is nothing new. Some of the unity movements described in this book are more than twenty-five years old already. But it seems the emphasis is changing and such movements are gathering momentum.

From Manchester, where the author/editor pastors a Baptist Church, to York, Liverpool, Southampton, Brighton and dozens of places in-between, church leaders are faithfully meeting in a spirit of unity to pray for their cities and to seek God for ways by which they can model the love of God where they live. The long-term aim is city-wide transformation, working in partnership with local government authorities and other charitable organisations to make their place better for everyone.
