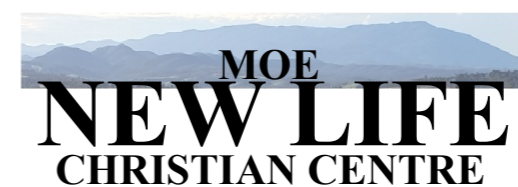


LIFT Conference 2020

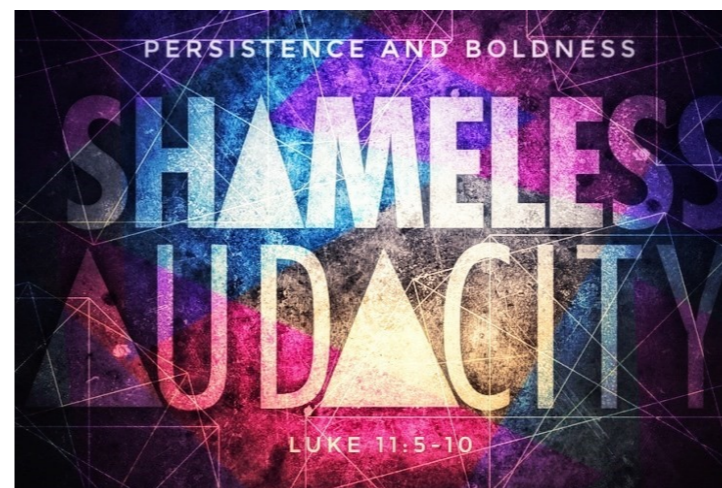

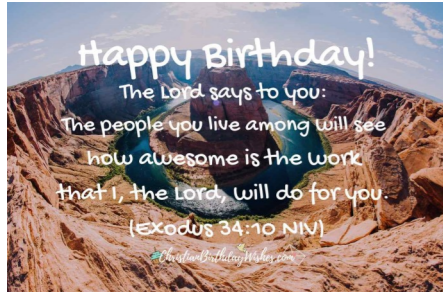

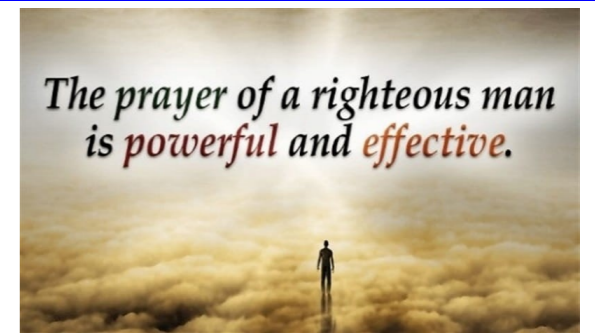
MISSIONS

BIBLE TRANSLATION OR PARAPHRASE?

With so many versions of the Bible available these days, it's important to understand the difference between a *translation* of the Bible and what we might call a *paraphrase*.

The difference is in the purpose of the translators or publishers. If the primary goal is to help people understand the Bible or to somehow bring it up to date for modern readers, that would probably be a *paraphrase*. The Message, for instance, does not attempt to translate word-for-word from the original Greek and Hebrew texts. It's a *paraphrase*.

On the other hand, if the publisher's goal is to be as faithful and accurate as possible to the original text, that is a *translation*. The King James Version, published in 1611, was designed as an accurate *translation*. However, many words have changed their meaning in the past 400 years. So there will always need to be some updating if we are to avoid confusion.

For devotional purposes, a good *paraphrase* will often be helpful. God can certainly speak through such Bibles. But for study purposes, we recommend a more literal translation, perhaps the New King James Version or New American Standard Version. No Bible version is perfect, however, and it's often helpful to compare different versions.
